Davis Tutt works for the United States
Olympic and Paralympic Committee as
the Coordinator in the National
Governing Body (NGB) Services
Department. In this position, he is
responsible for organizing the National
Governing Body Council, an association
of all NGB Executive Directors and
Board Chairs who serve as a
recommending body for the USOPC.
Davis also assists with the development

and implementation of strategic plans for each NGB as well as the NGB Services special grants program. Additionally, Davis oversees the NGB Best Practice Seminars, which provide NGB leaders a forum to share ideas and gain valuable insight from fellow members of the Olympic movement.

Prior to the USOC, Davis worked as a Program Associate for the El Pomar Foundation Fellowship. He was fully responsible for managing the Summer Internship Program, which included recruiting, selecting, and overseeing ten college students for the duration of the summer. Davis furthered El Pomar's impact in rural Colorado as director of the Central Peaks and Pikes Peak Regions. He directed many other El Pomar programs, including the Forum for Civic Advancement, the Wildland Fire Fund, the El Pomar-Denver Broncos Partnership, and taught Investment Challenge, principles of financial management class. Davis graduated from Colorado College with a degree in Art History and received the award for Top Senior Thesis of 2015 for his research on St. Paul's Cathedral. He was the recipient of a Keller Venture Grant, which allowed primary research on-site in London at the Cathedral as well as the Royal Society. Outside of academics, Davis interned for the United States Senate, The United States Olympic Committee, and the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center.

Outside of his professional pursuits, Davis is a member of the Fountain Valley School of Colorado Board of Trustees, the Colorado Springs Youth Sports Board of Directors, the Colorado Springs Pioneers Museum Board of Directors, and the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College Museum Subcommittee,



the AAM accredited committee responsible for overseeing museum operations and the collection. He also maintains a presence in the community as the Communications Director of Hillside Connections, weekly basketball camp, and mentorship program for low-income children on the southeast side of Colorado Springs.
